





# Report on Orientation Programme held for Amrit Interns from Cuttack district, Odisha

### **Background**

Indian Potash Limited (IPL) was established under the Indian Companies Act with the primary objective of import-handling, promotion, and marketing of potash throughout India. IPL is a significant player in various value chains and inputs, contributing to agricultural growth and the prosperity of farmers in India. IPL's field work has led to the acceptance of potash among Indian farmers, which was previously unknown to them.

As part of its Corporate Social Responsibility, IPL has gradually included activities focused on strategic spending and shared values. IPL strives to strike a balance between long-term social programs such as rural outreach, health improvement, and literacy initiatives, and areas like sustainability, productivity, and climate change.

The National Productivity Council of India (NPC), established in 1958, is an autonomous organization under the Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India. NPC conducts research in the field of productivity and provides consultancy and training services in various sectors, including industrial engineering, agri-business, economic services, quality management, human resources management, information technology, technology management, energy management, and environmental management.

IPL Centre for Rural Outreach (ICRO): ICRO was established by IPL as part of its Corporate Social Responsibility on March 17, 2022. NPC serves as the service provider for ICRO, assisting in the execution of projects.

**About the Amrit Internship Program:** The Amrit Internship Program is designed to provide hands-on experience to interns, exposing them to the real challenges faced in agriculture and rural development. It allows interns to apply their academic learning in real-life contexts, gain experience in their field, and acquire skills that will be valuable in their professional lives.

The objectives of the ICRO Amrit Internship Program are as follows:

- Promote productivity-related employment-enhancing vocational skills among youth and rural people.
- Create awareness about enhancing agriculture productivity.
- Create a network of youth entrepreneurs with skills to work in rural settings.
- Work towards improving knowledge resources on youth interface.
- Ensure environmental sustainability and conservation of natural resources.







The eligibility criteria for selecting interns include being a citizen of India with an Aadhar card, being at least 18 years old and not exceeding 40 years old, and having completed Class 12th, a diploma, or graduation. Preference is given to candidates with qualifications in agriculture or related sectors. The duration of the internship is three months.

To facilitate the program, an online application portal (<a href="www.icroamrit.npcindia.gov.in">www.icroamrit.npcindia.gov.in</a>) has been developed and hosted on the NPC website. The program brochure was prepared and circulated to various stakeholders, industry partners, and educational institutions. E-learning modules for interns have been developed and hosted on the internship portal by NPC. The interns are required to go through these modules and complete an assessment questionnaire. The internship program combines e-learning with field-level exposure through NPC regional offices and IPL facilities across the country.

Orientation programs for the Amrit Internship Program is conducted at various locations depending upon the convenience of the implementing agency and the interns. These programs are designed to provide interns with guidance on the application process, interacting with farmers, completing questionnaires, accessing e-learning modules, and lectures by experts in agriculture practices, innovative technologies, government programs, and agri-startup and entrepreneurship.

This program aims to equip interns with valuable skills and experiences, making them more employable and promoting entrepreneurial ideas and opportunities. The interns' contributions during the program will provide valuable insights into practical field issues and the local agro-climatic scenario.

### Amrit Internship programme for interns from Cuttack district, Odisha

The Amrit interns were identified by IPL. The Orientation Programme was held at ICAR, National Rice Research Institute, Cuttack on 6-7 September, 2022 and the Programme Schedule is attached at **Annex-A**. 50 interns registered for the programme are as per details at **Annex-B**.







The programme was attended by 50 interns and farmers were present in the entire programme. The welcome Speech was delivered by Mr. Baroda Prasad Bhuyan Jr. Sales Officers (Mktg.), IPL Odisha followed by Lighting of Lamp Ceremony by Dr. Rajeev Ranjan, Director ICRO, and Dr. U.S. Teotia , Chief Manager , IPL New Delhi , Mr. Sharad Kumar Tosh - Agriculture Development Officer (ADO), Ms. Monalisha Behra – Assistant Agriculture Officer (AAO), Mr. Sanjeev Chandra Sinha, SRM, IPL Odisha.

Mr. Sanjeev Chandra Sinha, SRM, ODISHA, in his opening address welcomed all the dignitaries on the dais and highlighted the activities being carried out by IPL and the role of ICRO for rural outreach.

He said IPL and NPC have jointly established IPL Centre for Rural Outreach (ICRO) with the involvement and technical expertise of NPC, The first programme launched was the ICRO Amrit Internship Programme. He said that the Amrit Internship Programme is a unique internship programme for youth in the rural areas. Dr. Ranjan said that the handbook released today has been brought out for the convenience of the intern as it gives an overview of the internship programme and steps to be followed to register on the online portal, access e-learning modules and collection of farmers' feedback on the online platform.

Dr Ranjan said that each intern is expected to reach out to 100 farmers during the period of internship. Through this three month internship programme, the intern will be exposed to learning experiences and new skills making them more employable and also promote entrepreneurial ideas and opportunities.

Dr Ranjan further said that the contribution of interns during the period will be valuable and give us firsthand insights to field level practical issues and also the overall local agroclimatic scenario. He explained regarding cropping management in case of sugarcane, role played by Krishi Vigyan Kendras in extension and outreach. He also explained about the Corporate Social responsibility and IPL intervention under CSR. He explained about the Role of Agriculture in GDP India is 5th Largest economic in the world. He talked about importance of nutritional security and the reasons for malnutrition etc.

Mr. Sarad Kumar Tosh, Agriculture District Officer, Cuttack, Odisha shared the details of Integrated Nutrient Management.

Ms. Monalisha Behra - Assistant Agriculture Officer shared the view on role of macro and micro nutrients in plant. She also asked farmer to focus on quality rather than quantity and detailed the government policy and their focus on rural youth, vocational training etc. She spoke about fertilizer intensive crop – sugarcane and intercropping farming. She also requested IPL to include women interns to promoted women employment.







Mr. Bipin Barik Panda, Scientist, NRRI spoke about how farmers can increase their income, issues/ problems of harvesting, cropping patterns etc. Dr. Rajesh Dash, Chief Statistics & Crop Insurance head of Govt. Odisha & Director of Agriculture explained the use of fertilizer.
